In 1993, Nuna began by building seasonal ice roads and executing site earthworks at diamond mines across the Northwest Territories and Nunavut. Today, we're the largest Inuit-owned civil contractor in Canada. We've developed more than 25 venture partnerships and corporate entities with Indigenous groups, communities and regional development corporations. Since our first job, we've expanded to our present-day capacity, where we can now plan and execute concurrent developments in excess of \$250 million per project.

Despite our size—that can extend to a workforce of over 900 people in remote locations throughout Canada's Northern Territories, Ontario, Saskatchewan and British Columbia—Nuna implements each project as if it was our only project. Adaptable and experienced, we function as a tactical partner that understands and anticipates each customer's current needs and future direction.
